### EXPERIENCING ART ... ... IN A UNIQUE BUILDING

The interaction between architecture and masterpieces helps you to look beyond the art. Take the time to marvel, connect and enrich yourself anew.

- Seven centuries of art history in 650 works of art. Selected with care. To tell a story, to confront and to question. The exquisitely renovated 19th-century museum section houses the Old Masters. The inspiring new section literally gives room to the Modern Masters. With James Ensor as the pivot between the two.
- 2. Marvel. About the stories behind the artists and their works. For art is about more than looking. Choose one of the three refreshing thematic tours in the museum app. Flash back to the 17th century via virtual reality and walk through Rubens' painting studio. 
#### **THE 10**

#### EXPO: THE MAKING OF

KMSKA, KAAN Architecten, Karin Borghouts (photographs)

Completely gutted, fully restored and with a brand-new museum section to boot: the KMSKA underwent the most spectacular renovation in its history. On 1 May 2011, the museum closed its doors.

Today, the 19th-century building shines as it did in times gone by. The museum is now also larger. A new museum volume has arisen in the former patios. KAAN Architecten drew up the master plan for this impressive makeover. Photographer Karin Borghouts has closely followed the renovation project. Her photos of ten years of demolition, construction and restoration guide you through the story of the master plan, from concept to completion.


#### EXPO: COSMORAMA

Ives Maes (realisation, photographs) in collaboration with KMSKA

Ives Maes photographs the heritage of world expos. And records the architectural vestiges of these short events and their locations. In this way he creates a picture of the world's greatest ambitions for the future: sometimes delivered with verve, often not. Cosmorama takes you on a fascinating journey from 19th-century London to contemporary Shanghai. With a stop at the KMSKA, which accommodated the world exhibitions in 1880 and 1894. The photographs of the architectural remains show an ironic contrast between utopian visions of the future and today's urban reality.

### **EXPO:**MICHEL SEUPHOR

The KMSKA was honoured with a wonderful donation: 57 lacunary drawings with horizontal lines by the Antwerp artist Michel Seuphor. As a token of our gratitude, we are pleased to display them in the Print Room. Michel Seuphor was a poet in heart and soul - in his drawings as well. His abstract lacunary drawings with horizontal lines lead the eye to the unlimited universe of the mind.

The drawings stand out beautifully against the steel blue walls in the Print Room. The spaces between the lines and the intervening shapes and words seem to emit light. The drawings resonate. Little by little, you are mesmerized by Seuphor's interplay of lines. Experience the power of abstract art for yourself.

For the 300th birthday of Peter Paul Rubens, Peter Benoit composed the Rubenscantata. It glorifies Antwerp and Flanders. The piece was written for open-air performance. At the world premiere in 1877 the choice fell on the Groenplaats in the centre of Antwerp. Adjacent to the Cathedral of Our Lady, where you will also find the statue of Rubens. Almost 150 years later, the stage is located on the museum square of the KMSKA. A musical ode to the museum's splendid Rubens collection.






#### **Royal Ballet School Antwerp**




